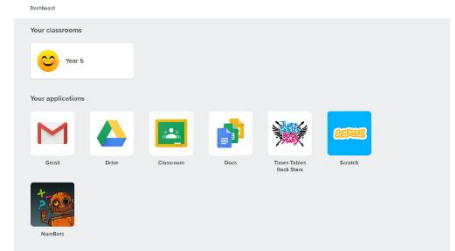


St Cuthbert's Primary Virtual Classroom Offer

Single Sign On

All children have a personalised Magic Badge (QR Code) and Emoji Password that allows them to access all of their personal accounts in school and at home through a Virtual Classroom hosted by edu.wonde.com – this enables the pupils to access applications such as Google Classroom, Times Table Rock Star and Spelling Shed in under 30 seconds through their own dashboard.

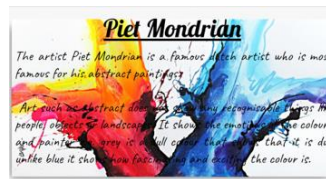
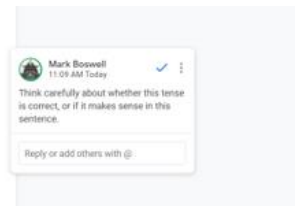


Google Classroom

Key staff across all of the primary schools have had a number of training sessions in getting up and running with the new Virtual Learning Environment and all primary teaching staff have had their first training session in using Google classrooms.

Teachers are able to set work and give instant feedback, both about a piece of work as a whole or more specifically within a piece of work. Children are already using the Google Classroom feature within school and at home to complete classwork and homework with lots of positive feedback.
